**Calling all parents!** Do you park near the school to drop off or pick up your children at the primary school? Concerns have been raised about where and how you are parking, and also the lack of consideration for other road users and pedestrians. This situation is becoming dangerous.

Please consider whether it is necessary for you to drive your children to school. Can you ease the congestion by walking your children to school? If you do need to drive, then please can we ask you to be more considerate when parking so that you are not obstructing the main thoroughfare, parking on pavements or blocking visibility splays.

Please **DO NOT** park on the grass verge. This is not a parking area.

When looking at the budget for 2023/24 in December, the Parish Council agreed to keep expenditure as low as possible despite rising costs to services. The Unitary Authority comes into force in April which could mean that the parish may potentially have to cover some costs that were not previously our responsibility, such as verge cutting and drain clearance. However, we are yet to find out how all this works.

With all this in mind, the Parish Council took the decision to increase the precept to £35,000 which means that the Band D rate will rise to £136.54 a year.
