National Census 2021

The Office for National Statistics (ONS) conduct a census survey every 10 years which every household in England and Wales must complete by law. Everyone, whether living or staying, in your household at the time of the census must be included. The next census will take place on Sunday, 21st March 2021. This census will not only provide a fresh picture of the population and our health, but it will also shed light on social and economic changes to our lives. It will provide the ONS with new information that can be used for years to come. This information will inform decisions on public services, including hospitals, schools, universities and job centres, to meet the needs of our changing society. Also, this year the Government will use the information to improve their understanding of the Covid-19 pandemic and how it has affected people.

The census has been designed to be simple, straightforward and safe to complete and will be a digital-first census. We are all being encouraged to complete the census online this year. However, if you are unable to get online or need assistance completing the census online, there will be Census Support Centres across England and Wales so help will be available by phone, webchat, email, social media or text messaging.

After the Census Day, at the end of March and into April, census field officers will be visiting the households of those who have not completed a census form. The field officers will be working in the same way as a postal or food delivery visit. They will be wearing Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and working in line with government guidance. The field officers will never need to enter your house.

Covid-19 Guidelines Update

The success of the vaccination rollout, alongside falling infections and hospitalisations, is paving the way for the safe and gradual lifting of restrictions. The Government published on 22nd February 2021 the 'Covid-19 Response – Spring 2021'. This is a 4-step plan to ease lockdown restrictions in England which will start on 8th March. The Government will monitor the situation carefully and depending on the Covid Status Certification all restrictions could be lifted by 21st June.

The planning application for the new pavilion was submitted at the beginning of December last year. Road Closure

Somerset County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 14 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, have made an Order prohibiting all traffic from proceeding along **Ham Hill Road** for a distance of **84.00 metres**. This Order will enable **Wales & West Utilities to lay a new gas connection**. The Order becomes effective on 18 March 2021 and will remain in force for eighteen months. The works are expected to commence on **22nd March 2021** and last until **25th March 2021** between the hours of **(00:00 - 23:59)** for a total of **4 days**.

- You will then be put in a 'Waiting Room' until you are invited to join.
- Once connected, you must click on the video camera icon at the bottom left-hand side
 of the screen to enable the video. This is so that councillors can see who is attending
 the meeting.

If you are accessing the meeting by telephone:

- Dial the number given to you by the Clerk.
- Once connected you will be prompted to type in the meeting ID plus #, then #, then the password plus #. You will be placed in a 'Waiting Room' until invited to join.

All microphones will be automatically muted from the start of the meeting. If you wish to participate in the public session your microphone will be unmuted when you are invited to speak.

Council meetings will continue in this form until such time as we are informed that public meetings/gatherings may take place in person.
